ARTS started in 2001, working with the Rady Childrens Hospital, where the focus was providing therapeutic arts to youth facing severe challenges.

#### 2007

Pat D'Arrigo ARTS Center opens at Liberty Station, where the organization was able to offer arts education and support services for youth (elementary-high school) under the tag line "Heal. Inspire. Empower."

2012

ARTS moved into the 20,000 sq. ft. building in National city where we reside today.

#### 2021

ARTS shifted from serving youth on clinical referral basis to a place-based focus on the South Bay, and, more specifically National City with a healingcentered approach to arts and design education for youth and young adults.


